

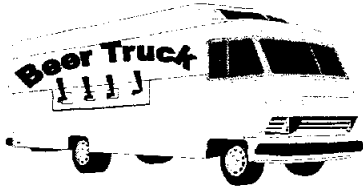
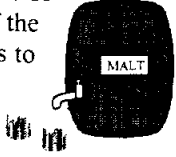
# CLARK COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS LICENSE

## LIQUOR LICENSE SUMMARY INFORMATION

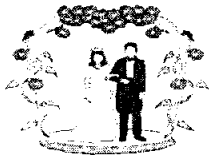


**MAIN BAR (8.20.020)** This permits the retail sale of alcoholic liquors across a bar for consumption **on-premises**. It is permitted in conjunction with: Resort Hotels (See Gaming Handout); certain leased businesses in Resort Hotels; Live Entertainment Venues; Hotels having at least 150 rooms and a restaurant; Time-Share Facilities; in 250 room hotels located in H-1 zones (gaming enterprise district); and in Resort Clubs.

**BREW PUB (8.20.020)** This permits the manufacture and storage of malt beverages on premises (subject to the provisions of Nevada Revised Statutes Chapter 597), the retail sale of said malt beverages for consumption **on-premises**, the retail sale of the packaged (sealed) malt beverages for **off-premises consumption only**, and the sale and transportation of said malt beverages to licensed wholesalers. A Brew Pub license may only be issued to holders of a valid Tavern Liquor License, Super Club Liquor License, or Main Bar Liquor Licensee in conjunction with a Resort Hotel. A Brew Pub *cannot* be located within 1,500 feet of another Brew Pub (Exemption: this restriction does not apply to Brew Pub licensees applying for licensure in conjunction with a Resort Hotel).



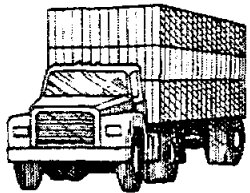
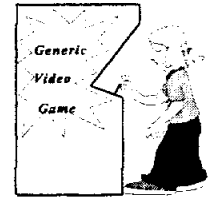
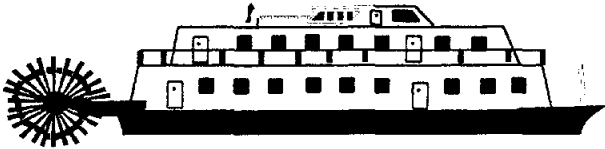
**LIQUOR CATERER (8.20.020 & 8.20.240)** This license allows the retail sale of alcoholic liquors at events and locations that do not have liquor licenses. Liquor service can be operated at the same location for a total of three (3) days in a one-week period and no more than twelve (12) times during any thirty (30) day period. More frequent use of Liquor Caterers at any location will constitute semi-permanent activity and require the location owner to file for their own liquor license. Liquor Caterers must file permits to conduct liquor service at weddings, parties, and other special events.



**BANQUET-RECEPTION HALL (8.20.020)** This license permits the retail sale of alcoholic liquors from a Portable Bar at events **on-premises** at a hall that can hold at least two-hundred (200) but less than four-hundred and ninety-nine (499) people. It is a permanent structure solely for the use of formal and special meetings, private parties, or associations, which meet to accomplish some specific civil, social, political, ecclesiastical, or business object or the exchange of ideas, views, and information of common interest to the group.



**FULL BAR (8.20.020)** This license permits the retail sale of alcoholic liquors at a bar **on-premises**. If the location operates a restaurant, minors may be permitted into the restaurant portion of the business if there is a physical barrier between the bar and/or lounge and the restaurant which is sufficient to prevent minors from entering the bar area. Full Bar licenses may be issued to Excursion Boats, Tournament Billiard Clubs, and Interactive Entertainment Centers.



**IMPORT-WHOLESALE LICENSE (8.20.020)** This allows a person to be the first person in possession of alcoholic liquors in Clark County after completing the act of importing it into Nevada. Importing and wholesaling alcoholic liquors (all types) requires a state license in addition to a county license. They must actually own the alcohol, not hold it on consignment, and they must sell it wholesale to licensed retailers. Wholesalers cannot have ownership, either directly or indirectly, of any licensed retail liquor license in the county (CCC 8.20.250).

### UNSUITABLE LOCATIONS FOR LIQUOR LICENSES (8.20.450) :



All locations within 1,500 feet of Churches, the nearest entry to School property and the customer entrance to Teenage Dance Halls are unsuitable locations for liquor licenses. Public Hearings may be conducted to allow for liquor licenses in Grocery Stores, Drugstores, Banquet-Reception Halls, Convenience Stores, convention pavilions, sandwich shops, restaurants, resort hotels, supper clubs, time-share facilities, Tournament Billiard Clubs and non-profit organizations. These restrictions do not apply to places approved before May 31, 1988 or to churches located in shopping centers, commercial centers or industrial complexes. In addition, Taverns located in commercial centers within 1,500 feet of churches may be licensed after a public hearing determines that the Health, Safety, and Welfare of the community will not be impaired by the issuance of a liquor license at the location. Package Liquor Stores are prohibited from being within 1,500 feet of churches and schools.

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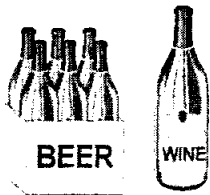
**LIQUOR STORE (8.20.020)** This is a specialty retail store which deals exclusively in alcoholic liquors and related items which include the sale of magazines, newspapers, tobacco products and packaged snack foods. Liquor Stores must have at least 1,200 square feet of floor space devoted to the display of this merchandise. Minors are not permitted in liquor stores. A Package Liquor License in a Liquor Store will not be granted to businesses with drive-up window service, or if it is within a 1,500 feet radius of the entry door of any other liquor store.



**PACKAGE LIQUOR (8.20.020)** This license permits **off-premises consumption only!** Except when granted with Taverns, Main Bars and in Resort Hotels, no Package Liquor License shall be granted to any establishment with a drive-up window or any establishment having less than 1,200 square feet of floor space devoted to the display of merchandise for sale to the public. It is permitted in Gift Shops, Liquor Stores in Resort Hotels, Liquor Stores, Convention Facilities, Grocery Stores, Specialty Food Stores and Drug Stores. Minors cannot be allowed into the closed-off areas where the "hard" liquor is displayed. Stores that have beer, wine, and spirit-based products displayed

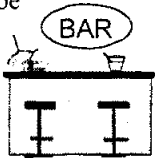
outside the "hard" liquor area must also have a Package Beer, Wine, and Spirit Based Products Liquor License (see below). A Package Liquor License in a Liquor Store will not be granted if it is within a 1,500 feet radius of the entry door of any other liquor store.

**WINE, BEER, CORDIAL, AND LIQUEUR TASTING (8.20.020)** This license permits the free distribution of ½ ounce samples of packaged wines, beers, cordials, and liqueurs sold at retail. It is permitted only in Liquor Stores in conjunction with a Package Liquor License and shall only be offered to the public for educational purposes relating to such tasting. The bottles of wines, beers, cordials, and liqueurs opened for tasting cannot be sold. *This does not allow the tasting of whiskeys, vodkas, tequilas, gins, or any other "hard" alcohol.*



**PACKAGE BEER, WINE AND SPIRIT BASED PRODUCTS (8.20.020)** This license permits the sale of beer, wine and spirit based products (where the alcohol content does not exceed 10% by volume or 20 proof) for **off-premises consumption only**. It is granted only to Convenience Stores, Taverns, Main Bars, Resort Hotels, Liquor Stores, Grocery Stores, Time-Share facilities, Specialty Merchandise Stores, Drugstores and Gift Stores. A Convenience Store must have at least 1,200 square feet but less than 6,000 square feet of retail floor space dedicated to the display of food and merchandise and at least one public restroom. Grocery Stores must have over 6,000 square feet of retail floor space dedicated to the display of food and merchandise.

**TAVERN (8.20.020/8.20.295)** This license permits a lounge or bar operation where all types of alcoholic liquors are sold at retail by the drink to the general public. Minors are not permitted entry into Taverns. If the Tavern has a restaurant operation, minors may be permitted into the restaurant portion of the business *if there is a physical barrier between the bar and/or lounge and the restaurant which is sufficient to prevent minors from entering the bar area*. No Tavern Liquor License will be granted unless the main entry door of the prospective tavern is more than 1,500 feet away from the main entry door of the nearest existing tavern licensee. *Exception:* One Tavern License may be granted to an applicant located in a commercial center (defined as a concentration of 150,000 sq ft of retail stores, including an anchor retail store larger than 50,000 square feet, sitting on at least 15 gross acres of land). The tavern cannot be the anchor store, and its square footage is not part of the 150,000 sq ft requirement for the center.



**SUPPER CLUB (8.20.020)** This license permits a restaurant to have a bar and lounge operation where alcoholic liquors are sold at retail by the drink to the public. The restaurant must have seating for at least fifty (50) people at tables or booths, and minors may be permitted into the *restaurant portion* of the business if there is a *physical barrier* between the bar/lounge and the restaurant which is sufficient to prevent minors from entering the bar area. Seating at the bar and in the lounge is dependant upon the number of seats at tables or booths in the restaurant and if there is gaming on the premises. For Supper Clubs with Class A Slot Machines having restaurant seating for fewer than 190 people, the bar can have one seat for every 15-restaurant seats and the lounge can have one seat for every 5-restaurant seats. For Supper Clubs without gaming and restaurant seating for fewer than 190 people, the bar can have one seat for every 8-restaurant seats and the lounge can have one seat for every 5-restaurant seats. Supper Clubs are monitored by periodic audits by the Department of Business License to ensure that the food operation is the main business and **not** the bar/lounge operation. Supper Clubs must keep their sales records for three (3) years and give receipts to customers that show their food and liquor purchases separately. Supper Clubs must maintain food sales at least 55% of the gross sales as compared to the sale of alcoholic liquor.



**SERVICE BAR (8.20.020)** This license allows for the retail sale and service of liquor by the drink by cocktail waitresses or waiters away from a regular bar. It does not permit sales direct to customers at a bar. This license is for establishments where drinks are served to customers' dining tables or booths in restaurants. Restaurants which have **only** a Service Bar are permitted to serve alcoholic beverages only at dining tables and booths and *only in conjunction with complete meals* ordered by restaurant patrons.

**RETAIL BEER AND WINE (8.20.020)** This license permits the sale of beer and wine in open containers for consumption **on-premises**. It is permitted in Billiard Parlors, hospitals (in conjunction with the birth of a child), restaurants and Category 2 Restaurants (49 or less seats). It is not permitted in fast food establishments or businesses with drive-thru window service.
